

**IAN LOGAN MEMORIAL AWARD  
(Direct Service Award and Leadership Award)  
NOMINATION GUIDE AND INSTRUCTIONS**

**CRITERIA OF INCLUSION FOR NOMINEES**

**PURPOSE:** The ILMA is to recognize an individual's work in the area of child abuse/maltreatment prevention. The award is not restricted to any one profession or only professionally designated persons, but is to recognize the work of any Manitoban who has enhanced the lives of children, youth and families across our province and in our many communities. Community is often a word used to define a place bound by geographical boundaries. Child abuse/maltreatment knows no boundaries and the ILMA recognizes those individuals whose work exceeds and embraces the many boundaries that define the term community in the Province of Manitoba (geographical, cultural, linguistic, religious, socio-economic, life choice and life circumstances).

In 2010, it became evident that our definition of community had grown and changed. Therefore, the ILMA awards were more clearly defined, and the selection process and nomination criteria were altered to reflect this change. Community continues to depict no boundaries, but with the World Wide Web, social networking, and easier travel, our world has in some ways become smaller. Relative to this, child abuse too has morphed for we know there are new ways to exploit and abuse children that did not exist when the ILMA was initiated. Today's candidates have a new world view on child abuse prevention and have attained new strategies to deal with our ever-changing world.

Sergeant Ian Logan believed that every person, regardless of who they are or their professional stature, can make a difference to a child, family or community. Sgt. Logan valued and encouraged everyone to have an active role in preventing child maltreatment. In order to maintain and uphold this value and to reflect the changes in our world today, the ILMA will now be comprised of two recipients: Ian Logan Direct Service Award and Ian Logan Leadership Award.

The Ian Logan Direct Service Award will ensure that individuals who day after day relentlessly dedicate themselves to the field work are recognized for their constant contribution. This direct service work which is challenging with few commendations or accolades is the grassroots work that ensures children are safe and family functioning enhanced.

The Ian Logan Leadership Award will ensure that individuals who effect larger systemic changes, legislative policy and procedures, and educate the public and professionals are recognized for their efforts and contributions.

Both recipients are accomplished and one without the other would result in a huge gap, therefore, both will be equally celebrated.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

- Consideration will be given to two candidates:
  - Direct Service Award
  - Leadership Award
- The nomination is valid only for one year.
- An individual can be nominated again the following year.
- All candidates nominated will be acknowledged at the award ceremony and presented with a certificate of recognition for their contributions to child maltreatment prevention.
- PACCA hosts the ILMA on a yearly basis; the host of the Award rotates from year to year.
- All Government departments which have representation on PACCA, all CFS Agencies, community organizations who are dedicated to the prevention of child abuse and participate in PACCA, law enforcement including WPS and RCMP, as well as the 4 Authorities are invited to attend the annual ILMA.

## CRITERIA FOR AWARD

- Nominees must be residents of Manitoba.
- Only individuals and not groups will be considered as candidates for the award.
- Nominees must have demonstrated depth and quality of work in the area of child abuse/maltreatment prevention.
- Nominees must have demonstrated that they have enhanced the lives of children, youth, families and communities through their work.
- Nominees are passionate about making positive changes which will empower children and families in the present and the future.
- Nominee's work with children, youth, families and communities can be either as a paid professional or in a volunteer capacity.
- Nominee's can be nominated for only one of the specific ILMA Awards; Direct Service Award or Leadership Award.
- Each candidate will be judged on the submission only; prior knowledge of the selection committee will not be a factor used to determine the successful recipient for either ILMA awards: Direct Service Award or Leadership Award.

## NOMINATION REQUIREMENTS

- Each nominee must consent and agree to be nominated prior to the nomination being submitted (must sign the application form).
- All nominations shall include a completed nomination form and a covering letter which clearly articulates which award the nominee is being submitted for; Direct Service Award or Leadership Award.
- All nominations shall include a maximum of two letters of support from other agencies, organizations or community individuals.
- The nomination form must include all the listed requirements as each candidate is scored accordingly.

- No additional information or papers should be submitted; the nomination application has been standardized and the space allotted for answers is all that will be reviewed by the selection committee.
- Ensure that the contact information on the completed application form is accurate and up to date (addresses and phone numbers).
